Regenerative farming group

Kaukapakapa lifestyle farmer Stephen Newman has formed a Kaipara Regenerative Farming Group, which with only its second meeting coming up this month already has more than 130 members.

Stephen's background was in IT, but he made a huge life switch in his mid-30s,

becoming a dairy farmer at Whangarei. Now retired, he farms cattle on his 9ha block.

He became enthused about regenerative farming after watching a Country Calendar programme on Peter Barrett of Linnburn Station in Otago, and then got started on the process himself with help from Jono Frew.

R e g e n e r a t i v e farming is "all about the soil". It does away with chemicals and traditional fertilizers, and replaces them with a variety of other methods to improve soil and pasture - and livestock - condition.

Since starting on his regenerative farming journey four years ago, Stephen has been working through the paddocks on his property, using a variety of methods including planting multi-species cover crops, using worm castings, fish and EM organic fertilizers, dung beetles, and humates (carbon-dense organic material rich in humus, humic, and fulvic acids).

He says he has already seen huge improvements in the quality of his paddocks,

with increased worm counts, deeper root growth, and heavier cattle.

"It is about the soil and biology. Once this is right other things follow - animal and plant health, carbon sequestration, lower input costs."

He came up with the idea of the

Facebook-based discussion group to help speed up the learning process by discussing what he and others are doing. While the group is online-based, the first physical meeting last December drew around 20 people. Members are predominantly lifestylers at this stage, with just a couple of commercial farmers something Stephen is very keen to see more of.

"My main aim is to get more commercial farmers," he says.

Big crowd for Anzac service

More than 500 people gathered at Kaipātiki Reserve cenotaph, Parakai, for the Anzac dawn service - the first held in several years.

The service was the only local public commemoration of Anzac Day, as the Helensville War Memorial Hall is closed for seismic strengthening. That meant the entire event was held at Parakai, with around 30 wreaths laid at the cenotaph by individuals and groups, including the Māori Battalion, Kaukapakapa RSA, and Te Poari o Kaipātiki ki Kaipara, which administers Kaipātiki Reserve.

After the Parakai service Kaipara Memorial RSA members held a wreath laying ceremony at the Helensville Service cemetery followed by a breakfast in their temporary 'home' at the Helensville Bowling Club.
