'Grow a Row' & help feed locals

Locals with green thumbs, or anyone who wants to learn how to garden, are being urged to get involved in the new 'Grow a Row' project by South Kaipara Good Food (SKGF).

They can do so by growing an extra row of kai in their garden - and SKGF can even provide the seedlings.

The local charitable trust has a team of staff and volunteers who are working hand-in-hand with the community to address food insecurity by encouraging those in need to be more food self-sufficient.

"We are getting no let-up in demand for kai packs as the cost of living and job losses continue to bite," says SKGF chief executive Gemma Donaldson.

"We currently prepare and distribute over 115 packs each week and our Kai Assist team are seeing 10 to 20 additional whanau arrive at our Kai Hub each week needing food. We are supporting people who have never needed help with food before. The costof-living crisis is hitting our whole community hard."

Gemma says SKGF is committed to ensuring all its kai packs contain plenty

of healthy food, "but higher costs are impacting us too. We currently spend a third of our food budget providing fresh fruit and vegetables."

Anyone who has a garden at home already can help by growing an extra row to donate.

"If you are already planting a garden with fresh produce for your family, why not just add a row of kai to give back to your local food organisation?" suggests Gemma.

"Things we go through a lot of and would be really useful for you to grow for us are veges like pumpkins, kumara, potatoes, silverbeet, spinach, cabbage, broccoli and cauliflower.

"We also gratefully welcome excess fruit."

SKGF can provide seedlings for anyone who has the time and garden space for an extra row.

Its new Mihirau Greenhouse development, a 700m2 free-leased greenhouse on the outskirts of Helensville is being used to raise seedlings (see June *Helensville News*).

"These seedlings are available to anyone who wants to join our Grow a

Row initiative just get in touch and we will arrange the rest," says Mihirau project lead, Andrea Sugar.

"We can also help anyone who wants to take part but who is not a confident gardener or is a newbie. I love helping people



learn to grow kai.

"I think there is a generation who have lost the education around growing food, as vegetables were so cheap in New Zealand before this cost-of-living crisis," she says.

"This project helps because part of that cost is going to be absorbed by us, and that makes it so much easier."

Mihirau and Grow a Row are just two of the latest initiatives by SKGF.

The organisation also recently brought on a Kai Rescue co-ordinator, longtime volunteer Amisha O'Brien, to bolster its work to redirect food from the landfill and into kai packs.

"Collecting food that can be rescued, redirecting it to fill kai packs and benefit our local community, fills my heart," says Amisha.

"Choosing to feed people before pigs (which is where excess, left-over food was going) and keeping food out of landfill is making such a difference to the quality of our kai packs."

SKGF has numerous regional and national contacts and often receives bulk rescued food. But it would love to redirect more local food from the landfill into kai packs too.

PANEL BEATING

Any businesses with excess food are welcome to reach out to Amisha.

"We have local cafes who freeze leftovers for us, we have local vege growers who sent us crates of produceit all finds a happy home instead of being chucked in the bin," says Gemma.

"Food insecurity is not something that is going away and we need to think a bit longer-term.

"SKGF is working hard to alleviate food insecurity for our local people, but a whole-community approach is central to this. Our volunteers and local funders and donors are crucial to our mahi.

"Grow a Row is another way locals can help our community become more resilient and help us fill hungry bellies in a sustainable way."
